Extreme Choice colt the star of Gold Coast 2YOs In Training Sale Magic Millions' juvenile auction exceeds expectations in face of

closed border with three youngsters breaking \$300,000 mark

colt by sire of the moment Extreme Choice (Not A Single Doubt) will head to Victoria after Baystone Farm's Dean Harvey made a strategic call to target the juvenile at yesterday's Magic Millions 2YOs In Training Sale on the Gold Coast in a market which proved stronger than many were expecting.

The \$350,000 colt, the highest-priced lot at the one-day sale and one of six two-year-olds to make more than \$200,000, will be trained by Leon and Troy Corstens, who have bases at Flemington, Geelong and a private property near Benalla in North East Victoria.

Millions had played expectations prior to the sale and, while it was one of the more challenging markets the company has presided over in the past 18 months, last night managing director Barry Bowditch was satisfied with the results given the obstacles faced by the auction house.

Assembling a smaller catalogue than in recent years, 85 horses were sold yesterday for total revenues of \$5,831,000 at an average of \$68,600 and a median of \$45,000, the latter two metrics revealed Continued on page 2>>

Victoria to conduct \$1 million summer sprint series

Racing Victoria (RV) and Melbourne's three metropolitan clubs will launch the inaugural 'Summer Sprint Series' this December. The series will be made up of four stakes races to be run over distances ranging from 1000 metres to 1200 metres and offering a combined \$1 million in total prize-money. The \$200,000 Kensington Stakes (Listed, 1000m) at Flemington on December 11 will Continued on page 7>>

<< Continued from page 1 figures up on the past two Magic Millions two-year-old sales, with a rise of 32 and 28 per cent respectively on 2020.

"I'm delighted, to be honest. The horses that were earmarked for this sale, bought as yearlings or prepared as this being their end goal, were very well supported in the sales ring here today," Bowditch said.

"Those professional breeze-up vendors had a great sale and they deserved to. It's evident in the market, as it has all year, that there is a great craving for product in Australia right now and I am pleased that the locals got in behind the sale and stumped up.

"There's still plenty going on and so to clear 70 per cent and average \$70,000 was a pleasing result and the clearance rate is only going to get better over the next day or two."

Despite a number of agents, trainers and owners being absent who would normally be in attendance due to border restrictions, some still chose to participate such as Baystone Farm's Harvey, Wattle Bloodstock's Peter Twomey and trainers Ciaron Maher, Kim Waugh and Tony McEvoy.

"This was one of the more challenging sales we've run over the last 18 months," Bowditch admitted.

"It was a very tricky sale to get organised given the fact that you were pretty much reliant on a Queensland market on-site, but the results when I reflect on them are solid and, as I say, the local market got behind the sale and really supported it."

Extreme Choice colt heading to Flemington

It was no surprise that the only Extreme Choice (Not A Single Doubt) two-year-old in the sale would be popular, such is the success of the Newgate Farm stallion's first crop two- and three-year-olds, which is demonstrated by his remarkable 24 per cent stakes-winners-to-runners ratio.

He already has six stakes winners from just 25 runners, including Golden Slipper- (Gr 1, 1200m) winning colt Stay Inside and Group 2 winner Tiger Of Malay in a foal crop of just 46.

Harvey jumped at the opportunity to buy a son of the in-demand stallion without having to encounter competition from the ever-growing number of colts syndicates that he would be up against in the yearling market.

"I can't play in that market with all the stallion funds at yearling time and I just thought a lot of those guys wouldn't be playing in the breeze-up market," Harvey said yesterday.

"There's not many Extreme Choices around and he's an elite stallion. What he's done so far has been unbelievable and they're going to make double that in the yearling market, if not more, for horses with his pedigree and type."

Breezing up in 11.27 seconds, the A List Stud-consigned Extreme Choice colt is the first foal out of winning mare Arnault (Fastnet Rock), a half-sister to Yesterday's Songs (Henrythenavigator) and Wakeful Stakes (Gr 2, 2000m) runner-up Rahveel (Zabeel). *Continued on page 4>>*





<< Continued from page 2 He was purchased by A List Stud's Chris Lee for \$130,000 from the Yarran Thoroughbreds draft at the Inglis Melbourne Premier Yearling Sale earlier this year.

Harvey had Magic Millions managing director Bowditch inspect the horse on the grounds and once he received the endorsement it came down to price.

"I liked him as a yearling - I should have bought him then, I would have saved myself a couple of hundred grand - but Extreme Choice hadn't done then what he's done now," the Baystone Farm proprietor said.

"He's gone to a new level, so he's entitled to make more (than he did as a yearling). He's ready to go, he'll have three or four weeks off at Kolora Lodge up there (Queensland) and then come down to Troy's and jump into his program."

Harvey and Corstens have a trading portfolio aimed at selling horses to Hong Kong but the Extreme Choice colt will not be one of them.

Among the pair's trades are three-year-olds Horse In Rock (Awesome Rock), a Tatura trial winner in September, and a son of Dundeel (High Chaparral) named Gary, a Tatura barrier trial winner in August, who has been purchased by agent George Moore. Both geldings will be trained by Caspar Fownes.

"We have got a horse called Fantastic Treasure who's had six starts for five wins and we sold a really nice horse who is there now called Silent Theory, a Nicconi horse," Harvey said.

"He had one start for a second in a Listed race (the Without Fear Stakes in Adelaide in May). Caspar Fownes is going to train him and we just sold a really nice Dundeel horse called Gary."

Yiu and Clarke make their mark on the Gold Coast with colts headed to Hong Kong

While the top-priced colt will remain in Australia, the next two most expensive juveniles are bound for Hong Kong after champion trainer Ricky Yiu combined with Queensland agent Jim Clarke to land a colt by Capitalist (Written Tycoon) for \$330,000 and a son of Smart Missile (Fastnet Rock) for \$325,000.

Yiu and Clarke also bought a Rothesay (Fastnet Rock) colt for \$120,000 from the Nolen Racing draft earlier in the session, who in recording a time of 10.20 seconds posted the quickest breeze of the sale.

The Capitalist colt, by the same sire as Group 1 winner Captivant and high-class sprinter Profiteer, breezed up last month in 10.43 seconds at Newcastle, the fastest time of the NSW session.

Yiu already has a Capitalist in his stable and he was impressed by the manner in which the O'Gorman Racing-prepared colt handled the occasion.

"In his breeze-up he showed a very good turn of foot and his conformation is the type that I like," Yiu said from Hong Kong yesterday.

"I think he's about the right size and Capitalist is doing really well in Australia."

Mel O'Gorman, who offered the top lot at last year's Magic Millions two-year-old sale, bought the colt for \$90,000 from Book 2 session on the Gold Coast in January from the Murrulla Stud draft.

Catalogued as Lot 26, he is the first foal out of three-time winner Solar

Burst (Northern Meteor), herself a daughter of Lekhani (Imperial Ballet), a half-sister to Group 1-producing stallion Myboycharlie (Danetime).

"The stallion is flying and the horse breezed well – he ticked so many boxes," Clarke said.

"I liked the horse at the yearling sale here in January and Ricky really liked his breeze – he picked him out and I was delighted to be able to work with him at the sale today."

Solar Burst, whose second foal is a Super One (I Am Invincible) yearling colt, was sold for \$5,500 via the Magic Millions Online Auction in May to Mossvale Pastoral.

Twin Hills Stud stallion Smart Missile's progeny have proven popular at two-year-old sales for a number of years owing to their success in Asia and that fact was not lost on Yiu when splashing \$325,000 for a colt by the sire yesterday.

Breezing up at the Gold Coast in 10.86 seconds as Lot 39, he is a half-brother to three winners from three to race for dam Twin Star Rocket (Bel Esprit), herself a half-sister to Listed winner Ever The Same. Twin Star Rocket was sold at the 2020 Inglis Australian Broodmare Sale for \$15,000 carrying a sister to the \$325,000 colt.

He was a pinhook result for A List Stud's Chris Lee who paid \$230,000 for him from the Gooree Park Stud draft in January.

Yiu said: "Smart Missile is very, very popular in Hong Kong and they do the job. They like the environment in Hong Kong and so this one ticked all the boxes for me and I like him a lot."

Smart Missile is the sire of 24 individual winners of 51 races in Hong Kong, including the Group 3-placed Fat Turtle.

Early in the session, Clarke and Yiu signalled their intent with the acquisition of the Rothesay colt who ran a slick 10.20 seconds in his breeze-up at Seymour.

The Nolen Racing-consigned colt is the first foal out of Rhodopis (Real Saga) and was purchased by Mitchell Williams for \$16,000 from the Vinery Stud draft at the Magic Millions National Yearling Sale in early June.

"I think he was a very reasonable price and is a good investment and he will have a bright future," said Yiu.

"Generally speaking, the quality of the two-year-olds at the Magic Millions has improved significantly compared Continued on page 5>>

<< Continued from page 4 to last year. I think the vendors and the farms are sending their better quality two-year-olds to the Magic Millions sale.

"There are quality horses there and, with a bit of luck, I've been able to buy three."

Yiu was also active at the Inglis Ready2Race Sale last month, relying on Dean Hawkes for guidance when going to \$320,000 for a son of Vancouver (Medagalia d'Oro).

The quartet will be spelled before continuing their education in NSW at Muskoka Farm prior to being sent to Hong Kong in July or August next year.

Like almost every racing industry participant, Yiu has been forced to adapt to buying horses from afar and instead relied on the likes of Hawkes and Clarke to help assess horses to potentially buy.

"Normally I'd be at the two-year-old and yearling sales, so I would come to Australia roughly five to six times altogether each year, but because of Covid-19 I've been unable to travel. I always love to come to the sales to see the horses myself," he said.

Leading buyer Clarke, meanwhile, also combined with Sydney trainer Bjorn Baker and Cunningham Thoroughbreds to take home a daughter of Zoustar (Northern Meteor) for \$220,000 from the Nolen Racing draft.

Catalogued as Lot 60, the filly is out of Avenue Whisper (Street Cry), making her a granddaughter of Group 3-winning sprinter Avenue (Anabaa) who, in turn, is a sister to Group 1-winning mare Virage De Fortune. She breezed up in 10.42 seconds at Seymour.

A List leading Gold Coast vendor

A List Stud was the leading vendor by aggregate (\$1.105 million) and average (\$221,000) after selling five of its 11 juveniles offered.

Baramul Stud's Gerry Harvey, also the owner of Magic Millions, will always have a big say in the overall figures of the 2YOs In Training Sale because of the size of his draft and the fact that he races a large number of horses in Australia and New Zealand, so does not necessarily need to part with them.

As of last night, however, Baramul Stud had sold 26 of its 35 two-year-olds from prices which ranged from \$2,000 to \$100,000.

"Considering we didn't have the amount of buyers that we normally have there, to get that amount sold was a huge accomplishment. Magic Millions did a really good job in promoting every single horse and getting the footage we need up on to the sale site," Harvey's racing and bloodstock manager Luke McDonald said.

"Gerry doesn't like giving them away, but I felt we set some reasonable reserves and some horses that we are taking home, we're happy that we are.

"They are going to be extremely good racehorses and we'll place them in the correct stables and go onto bigger and better things. $\,$

"The ones that we did sell were really nice horses as well and they found the right homes at the right prices."

New Zealand Bloodstock will hold its Ready to Run Sale next week, November 17 and 18, from Te Rapa in a virtual auction format.

Cranbourne Cup Day sees strong nominations

This year's edition of Cranbourne Cup (Listed, 1600m) day will mark the first in which it has been held as a standalone Saturday meeting, moving from the usual Sunday slot. The race will also be dropped in distance, from 2025 metres to the 1600-metre trip, while also providing the winner with a larger cheque. The move seems to have paid off, with Saturday's feature currently shaping up to be a hotlycontested race, as nominations include the Matthew Williams-trained gelding Harbour Views (Le Havre) who currently heads the betting as a \$6 chance. The winner of The Sofitel (Listed, 1400m) on his seasonal return, he will have his fourth run back from a spell and will be looking to go three places better than his recent fourth-placed effort in the Seymour Cup (Listed, 1600m) when carrying the top weight. Winx Guineas (Gr 3, 1600m) winner Our Playboy (Sebring) and last-start Chatham Stakes (Gr 3, 1400m) winner Age Of Chivalry (He's Remarkable) look set to take their place in the field, with Damian Lane likely to stick with the latter. Group 1 runners Buffalo River (Noble Mission), King Magnus (Magnus) and Quantum Mechanic (Deep Field) are also likely to head for the contest after their performances in the Cantala Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) a fortnight

Cranbourne Cup for Don't Doubt Dory

Julien Welsh is prepared to saddle up Don't Doubt Dory (Fiorente) in Saturday's Cranbourne Cup after he gained an automatic qualification to the race following his win in

the Peninsula Cup (1600m) at Mornington on October 31. The Pakenham-based handler has worked with many horses who have gone on to stakes success, but admits that training one himself would be something extra special. The five-year-old has won seven of his 16 starts, with the only two poor runs of his career coming in rain-affected conditions in the two previous renewals of the Moe Cup (2050m). "Absolutely, he'll definitely be going around if everything stays 100 per cent with him," Welsh told Racing. com. "Hopefully he brings his best form back for it but there's no reason why he won't, he's going really well. He just doesn't seem to like Moe, I've run him in the Cup there the last two years and he's performed poorly both times. And I know he's won on a heavy track, but I still think he's a better horse on top of the ground."

Standout looking to add to his stakes tally

Saturday will mark the third running of the \$1 million The Hunter (1300m) and among the current nominations are The Everest (1200m) fourth Lost And Running (Per Incanto), last year's winner Sweet Deal (Casino Prince) and the Gerald Ryan and Sterling Alexiou-trained Standout (Exceed And Excel). The latter named has been a consistent horse for the training partnership having made the frame in the Premiere Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m), Sydney Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) and the Classique Legend Stakes (1300m) on his last three outings, with career prize-money earnings over the \$850,000 mark. "He's won \$400,000 this time in and he hasn't won a race," Ryan said. "It's all about the firm tracks, it makes a huge difference to him." Still an entire, the five-year-old's best win to date came in the Expressway Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) on February 1 last year and he will be looking to add to that in this weekend's big-money feature at Newcastle.

Bateup hoping to continue rich vein of form

Theresa Bateup is hoping that her brilliant run of form can continue this week as she has starters at Gosford, Hawklesbury and home track Kembla Grange. Having had two winners and five placings from her last eight runners, the Kembla Grange-based trainer has Foxtrot Bravo (Foxwedge) nominated for a Benchmark 64 over 1900 metres at Gosford today and she is confident that the five-year-old is ready to run to his best on his third run after a spell. "He's going super," Bateup said. "He's never been a horse that we've had huge rap on, but he just tries so hard and he's come back better this preparation. Nothing surprises me with him now and you know you are going to get 110 per cent every time he steps out." Bateup will then move on to Hawkesbury tomorrow as she takes Proisir (Choisir) gelding Shaka Rock, with the hope that the forecast rain arrives. "I've been dying to get him onto a wet track," Bateup said, with the handler then running five-year-old Alan (Zoffany) in the Class 1 Handicap over 1200 metres at Kembla Grange on Saturday.

Newmarket possible for Artorius

Having ridden Artorius (Flying Artie) for the first time in the Coolmore Stud Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) on Derby Day, Glen Boss is convinced that the three-year-old is a class act after he finished well to take third in the Group 1 contest. "He's a jet, he just has to put it all together," Boss told Racing.com. "Incredible three-year-old and in my opinion he's an autumn horse, he's a bit of a juvenile. I know he's won a Blue Diamond

and he's competed at a good level for a long time but my first feelings when I rode him: this horse is not there yet. He still hasn't quite put it all together." Currently on a break, the son of Flying Artie (Artie Schiller) could be an exceptional talent for training duo Anthony and Sam Freedman and Boss has urged the pair to stick to sprint trips with the colt. "I think we'll target the Newmarket Handicap and maybe tinker with some gear, I'm not sure he needs the blinkers," Sam Freedman told Racing.com. "He's gone for a well-earned break. He's still got a lot to learn, he is still so raw but highly talented and he's still managed to place in a Guineas and a Coolmore this preparation."

Railway ruled out for Regal Power

Owner Bob Peters confirmed yesterday that his Regal Power (Pierro) will not contest the Railway Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) as he sticks to his original plan of targeting weight-for-age races the Kingston Town Classic (Gr 1, 1800m) and Ted Van Heemst Stakes (Gr 2, 2100m) for the six-year-old. A winner of seven of his 25 career starts, the son of Pierro (Lonhro) was last seen in the winner's enclosure when he won the All-Star Mile (1600m) at Caulfield on March 14 last year under William Pike, where he beat fellow Bob Peters-owned rival Superstorm (Sebring), a subsequent winner of the Feehan Stakes (Gr 2, 1600m) and Cantala Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) just over a week ago.

Dirty Thoughts heads Inglis Digital sale

The countdown to the end of bidding is near for the Inglis Digital November (Early) Online Sale and mares lead the early sale toppers headed by recent Group 3 winner Dirty Thoughts (So You Think). The Mathew Ellerton and Simon Zahra-trained four-year-old, who won the Northwood Plume Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) at Caulfield in October, was spelled after copping interference in the Begonia Belle (Gr 3, 1100m) at Flemington on Derby Day. Her price was sitting at \$250,000 last night while her half-brother by Choisir (Danehill Dancer) sold for \$100,000 to Brisbane trainer Chris Munce yesterday at the Magic Millions 2YOs In Training Sale. New Zealand-based mare

Powerplay (Power), an unraced half-sister to Listed winner She's Alight (Tavistock), was trading at \$190,000. She is being offered for sale by Jen Campin Bloodstock in foal to champion New Zealand stallion Savabeel (Zabeel) and with a Justify (Scat Daddy) filly at foot. Crystal Rock (Fastnet Rock), the dam of Sydney Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) winner Big Parade (Deep Field), had also reached three figures. She is being sold with an early cover to Star Turn (Star Witness). No interstate runners at Perth Carnival

The news last week that WA will not reopen its borders interstate until at least January or February has effectively ruled out participation in the upcoming Perth Carnival for interstate raiders. "We are all very disappointed about not getting there," said Chris Calthorpe, who heads Air Horse Transport. "I've spoken to some of the biggest stables and everyone is shattered about not being able to get there. I've had interest from the likes of Ciaron Maher, Adam Trinder, the McEvoys, Will Clarken and Godolphin were really keen as well as Chris Waller. It's pretty disappointing. I don't understand how they can organize a (AFL) grand final but can't do this. It's a fantastic carnival and the club can't do enough for you but unfortunately the border is shut for the second year in a row." The Carnival ramps into gear this month, with the WA Champion Fillies Stakes (Gr 3, 1600m) on Saturday, followed by Group 1 features the Railway Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m), Winterbottom Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) and Kingston Town Classic (Gr 1, 1800m) in the following weeks.

Racing Victoria (RV) and Melbourne's three metropolitan clubs will launch the inaugural 'Summer Sprint Series' this December. The series will be made up of four stakes races to be run over distances ranging from 1000 metres to 1200 metres and offering a combined \$1 million in total prize-money. The \$200,000 Kensington Stakes (Listed, 1000m) at Flemington on December 11 will kick off the series, followed by the \$200,000 Christmas Stakes (Listed, 1100m)

at Caulfield on December 26, the \$250,000 Standish Handicap (Gr 3, 1200m) at Flemington on January 15 and the \$350,000 Australia Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) at Moonee Valley on January 29 will then follow to complete the series. Further incentives are also on offer, with the winner of the Christmas Stakes exempt from the ballot for the Oakleigh Plate (Gr 1, 1100m) at Caulfield, and the winners of both the Standish Handicap and the Australia Stakes granted exemption in the Newmarket Handicap (Gr 1, 1200m) at Flemington. "The \$1 million Summer Sprint Series is an exciting new initiative which we hope will lead to an increase in field sizes and the quality of these races, giving connections the option of running their star sprinters in all four legs of the series," said Greg Carpenter, RV's executive general manager.

Azzopardi joins up with Malua Racing

Western Australian apprentice Chloe Azzopardi will move to Victoria this week to link up with the Malua Racing team of Leon and Troy Corstens. Azzopardi sits on 146 wins, including a Group 3 win on Valour Road (Frost Giant) last year. "Really looking forward to it, she's obviously a really good rider from over there and I've got a family connection because her brother Joey used to be apprentice to us for a while when he came over," Troy Corstens said. "You'd hope that she can come over and hit the ground running. She's done a great job over there (WA), she's very good on them, she's got lovely hands, she'll be riding a lot of trackwork here and a lot of outside trackwork as well. She'll come over and she'll work hard, and if she can ride some winners she'll get the luck that she deserves."

Lawrence sidelined

Apprentice jockey Mikaela Lawrence will be out of action for at least the next six weeks after it was found she had fractured her tibia in a storm-related trackwork accident in Melbourne late last month. "It was that really bad windy morning and raining and the rails were coming down," Lawrence told Racing.com. "One of the riders came off their horse and then it caused me to come off my horse. The fall wasn't that bad, but my horse kicked me in the leg as I fell

so it was very unfortunate. Generally I'm the type of person who gets up straight away – but I couldn't this time." The 27-year-old is hoping that further scans won't reveal any other injuries and that she can return to work by Christmas. "I've fractured my tibia but it wasn't displaced or anything so I didn't need surgery, So luck was on my side there," she said. "Six weeks is the best-case scenario so I'm hoping it stays like that."

Covid cases emerge from Cup afterparty

A group of people that attended the Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) afterparty with connections of winner Verry Elleegant (Zed) have tested positive for Covid-19. Part-owner Ozzie Kheir is understood to be among the group that have subsequently tested positive following the celebrations at a CBD restaurant. Over 100 guests attended the party, including top sporting identities both from inside and outside the racing industry. The news comes not long after two positive Covid-19 cases were linked to Melbourne Cup day last Tuesday, where 10,000 spectators were allowed to attend Flemington racecourse.

The Gift that keeps on giving

After gladly taking up the chance to acquire then filly The Gift (Power) for no charge, Robert Dennis is now reaping the rewards as he prepares the four-year-old for the Canterbury Breeders' Stakes (Gr 3, 1400m) at Riccarton tomorrow. The mare has won five of her 16 starts so far, including the NZB Insurance Stakes (Listed, 1400m) over the same course and distance last season. "When Brendan and Jo Lindsay took over Cambridge Stud they had ten or 15 yearling fillies that weren't quite up to taking to the sales," Dennis said. "They decided not to race them themselves and rolled them out for nothing to a few trainers around the country. The Gift was one of them and she ended up here. I syndicated her and the rest is history and that's how she got her name, it was very generous of the Lindsays." Dennis has resisted the temptation of the Coupland's Bakeries Mile (Gr 2, 1600m) in favour of heading for the softer chance, and he is confident about her chances under Krishna Mudhoo despite the wide barrier draw. "She's got a stakes win and a couple of placings on the board and she's in fine form this season and I don't see why it won't continue tomorrow." Dennis said.

Rose to bloom in the Coupland's

Following successive wins in her last two starts, Miss Tycoon Rose (Written Tycoon) will arrive into the Coupland's Bakeries Mile in peak health. Trained by Michael and Matthew Pitman, the four-year-old was runner-up in last year's New Zealand 1,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) and has been raced sparingly in order to gain a nice racing weight. "She had to have an operation on her knee to remove a chip after the 1,000 Guineas, that's why she lost the majority of her three-year-old career until we brought her in and she went up to Te Rapa for the Cambridge Breeders' Stakes, where she had no luck at all," Michael Pitman said. "She's had two very bold wins this campaign and we made the decision that we wouldn't go to the well again a couple of weeks ago in case she won again and just got a bit more weight. I think she gets in pretty well at the weights. Had she raced again and won the other day, she would have ended up with 57 kilograms or 58 kilograms. I think we've done the right thing." Craig Grylls will take over the reins from apprentice jockey Kavish Chowdhoory and the mare will jump from barrier two.

Levante on target for fruitful campaign

Ken Kelso is hoping that Levante (Proisir) could be an even tougher horse to beat this season after she impressed in a 1000-metre trial at Matamata last week. The Group 2-winning mare has won seven of her 11 career starts and cruised to the line to beat Brando (Savabeel) after racing up with the pace and Kelso, who trains in partnership with his wife Bev, is hoping it marks a sign of things to come this campaign. "I don't think she needs to be dropped out as much as she was in the past, so that was a pleasing aspect of what she did," he said. "I'm very happy with the way she's coming up." The

five-year-old will follow a similar path to that of last season, beginning her campaign with the Counties Bowl (Listed, 1100m), a race that she won last year, before then heading on to the Sistema Railway (Gr 1, 1200m) at Ellerslie on New Year's Day. "She's probably at the same stage as she was last year, though she's going to get a lot more than the 53 kilograms she got last year in the Counties Bowl," Kelso said. "After the Bowl she'll head to the Railway, though whether she has a run in between we don't know. She didn't last year but being a year older she might want one race in between."

Plenty of Merit in runnerup finish

Meritable (Snitzel) has shown himself to be a model of consistency in his five career starts to date and once again proved that to be true as he finished second to impressive winner Noverre (Savabeel) in the New Zealand 2,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) on Saturday. Already runner-up to Pareanui Bay (Lonhro) in the Memorial Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m) and a closeup fourth in the Hawke's Bay Guineas (Gr 2, 1400m) this season, the three-year-old found things going against him in Saturday's contest but still managed to put in a very creditable performance under Matthew Cameron. "It was a super run, he's a horse who normally goes forward, we kind of mucked-up the start a little bit," Cameron said. "We were a bit slow so we went back, it was a moderate enough pace, they stacked up a bit before the turn and it got a bit messy. I thought given where the favourite was (back last), we needed to get on that three-wide train and try and pocket them in as much as I could because I knew my horse would probably come up short at a mile. The better horse on the day beat him but I'm very proud of him, he's a lovely colt going forward." Bred and raced by the China Horse Club, Meritable is likely to have a spell after a trip south.

Glorious Dragon (Teofilo), Columbus County (Redwood), Russian Emperor (Galileo) and Savvy Nine (Anodin) make up the other entries.

25 for Night Of Thunder

It was a 25th individual stakes winner for Night Of Thunder (Dubawi) as his son Night Tornado (4 c ex Tornadea by Sea The Stars) ran out a narrow winner of the Prix Du Grand Camp (Listed, 2400m) at Lyon Parilly yesterday.

Trained by Krzysztof Ziemianski and ridden by Stefano Mura, the four-year-old started as one of the outsiders in the field but managed to hold on by a neck at the line from the hattrick chasing Mutabahi (French Fifteen) with Inchicore (Galileo) a further three lengths back in third place. A €7,500 purchase by his trainer at the Arqana Autumn Sale in 2018, the colt races in the colours of owner Joanna Traka. Tornado is the second foal out of unraced dam Tornadea (Sea The Stars), who is closely related to winners Muirin (Born To Sea) and Sea Of Reality (Born To Sea). Night Of Thunder stood at Kildangan Stud in 2021 for a fee of €75,000 (approx. AU\$117,000).

157 for Medaglia d'Oro

Rockefeller (2 c ex Dance To Bristol by Speightstown) gave Medaglia d'Oro (El Prado) his 157th individual stakes winner when he ran out a ready victor of the Nashua Stakes (Gr 3, 8f) at Belmont Park on Sunday. Starting as the 4-5 favourite, the Bob Baffert-trained two-year-old showed good gate speed to lead under Luis Saez and managed to go pillar-topost to win by two and three-quarter lengths over Cooke Creek (Uncle Mo) with the same distance further back to the third-placed Judge Davis (Distorted Humor). Bred by Colts Neck Stables, the colt was a \$750,000 purchase for SF Racing and Starlight Racing at the Keeneland September Yearling Sale in 2020. The third foal out of Grade 1-winning mare Dance To Bristol (Speightstown), Rockefeller is a brother to US winner Dance For The Gold. Medaglia d'Oro will stand at Jonabell Farm in 2022 for a fee of US\$100,000 (approx.

The Cartier 3YO Colt: Adayar (Frankel), Baaeed, Hurricane Lane (Frankel), and St Mark's Basilica. The Cartier 3YO Filly: Alcohol Free (No Nay Never), Mother Earth (Zoffany), Saffron Beach (New Bay), and Snowfall (Deep Impact). Juddmonte announce nomination fees

The 2022 nomination fees for Juddmonte Farms were announced yesterday for the five stallions that currently stand at Banstead Manor Stud near Newmarket. Frankel (Galileo) remains the highest-priced stallion at the farm and has been given a £25,000 increase on his 2021 fee, commanding a service fee for 2022 of £200,000 after having his best season yet, siring eight individual Group 1 winners including two Derby (Gr 1, 1m 4f) winners, an Oaks (Gr 1, 1m 4f) winner and three Group 1-winning twoyear-old's. Kingman (Invincible Spirit) has also remained at his 2021 fee of £150,000 after siring Group 1 winners on three continents with Palace Pier, Domestic Spending and Schnell Meister among 18 stakes winners in total. While Oasis Dream (Green Desert) makes up the trio of stallions that see their fees remain the same as for the 2021 season, standing at £20,000 after siring dual Group 1-winning two-yearold Native Trail, who is currently the ante-post favourite for the 2022 2,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1m). Bated Breath (Dansili) saw his fee increase from £12,500 to £15,000 for the 2022 season while Expert Eye's (Acclamation) fee was lowered from £12,500 to £10,000.

Kiwi, Kiwi!, KIWI!

rior to last Tuesday and the stunning Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) victory by Verry Elleegant (Zed), the above trifecta of words was reserved for the original Kiwi (Blarney Kiss), the 1983 winner.

The similarities are noteworthy.

Both are from very humble New Zealand backgrounds. Kiwi was bought by farmer Snowy Lupton for the princely sum of \$1,000.

Verry Ellegant's dam was purchased for \$14,000 then sent to Zed (Zabeel), whose service fee was \$5,000 (although breeder Don Goodwin is a shareholder).

Both are/were trained by a New Zealander. Both are/were ridden by a New Zealand jockey.

Kiwi spent most of his life at Lakeside, Lupton's property just a minute east of the small South Taranaki town of Waverley. He was the epitome of a working horse. No cushy stable life for him. When he wasn't winning races he was regularly employed rounding up sheep.

Verry Elleegant was foaled a mere 12 kilometres further south east of Waverley near an even smaller village named Waitotara, at Grangewilliam Stud. The stud was originally established by Capt. Tim Rogers and is now owned and operated by the Corcoran family, principally Mark and his wife Jane, who took over from Mark's parents John and Anne.

The mare herself is so honest. She gives her best no matter what, yet in some ways, she is perhaps fortunate to have reached the incredible heights she has.

Not too long after her fabulous win we learned that when Verry Elleegant first showed up at Nick Bishara's stable she was quite a handful. So much so, she had to go back to the breakers and go through that process all over again.

Imagine if her ways were not overcome?

James McDonald describes the mare as "awkward" which may be code for "has a mind of her own" and it would be interesting to have him expand on that.

That same term could easily have been applied to her great grandsire, Sir Tristram (Sir Ivor), and perhaps he is one reason for the mare's "personality".

Certainly, in the human world, extraordinary talent is often associated with individuals who have a mind of their own. Why not in the equine world?

Happily for we racegoers, when the mare is on the racetrack, look out. She has stacks of ability and talent, not to mention heart.

On Cup day there was a gathering at Grangewilliam as the Waverley Racing Club is establishing a fund, raising money that will be used for a bronze statue of Kiwi, slated for a prominent place in the township. If there is any cash left over, they might keep the fund open and add a statue of Verry Elleegant for Waitotara.

Scintillating Savabeel

For the first classic of the current New Zealand season, a new star emerged at Riccarton on Saturday.

His chances looking especially dim starting

the run for home in the New Zealand 2,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m), Te Akau Racing's Noverre (Savabeel) produced a powerhouse finish to claim his third win and second at stakes level in seven starts.

Last upon straightening, Opie Bosson tugged hard on the right rein and the colt angled out for clear running. Four lengths from the lead at the 200-metre mark he was flying. He was then levelled up at the 100 metres before booting clear. At the line he was coasting, two and three quarters in front in a devastating effort.

Noverre displayed good acceleration in winning the War Decree Stakes (Gr 3, 1600m) at Ashburton, two weeks prior, but this performance was at a different level and against a talented group of three-year-olds.

Second-placed Meritable (Snitzel) has been consistent in the lead-ups, including a close second in the James & Annie Sarten Memorial (Gr 2, 1400m) on Labour Day. While Field Of Gold (Starspangledbanner) in third was a very good second to Noverre in the War Decree Stakes and is highly regarded by top trainer Tony Pike.

Fourth-placed Mana Nui (No Nay Never) won a competitive Hawke's Bay Guineas (Gr 2, 1400m) a month ago.

The above underlining the strength of the opposition so ably dismantled by Noverre.

January's Karaka Million 3YO Classic (RL, 1600m) is the next target but even bigger prizes and prestige could be on the horizon.

"What we do after the Karaka Million 3YO Classic, who knows?" said trainer Jamie Richards.

"He could stay here or he could be an Australian horse. We will just be guided by how the next couple of months go. He has got plenty of options. He could be an Australian Guineas type over a mile at Flemington on a big roomy track, he'd love that.

"We have brought a few colts over and gone home with our tail between our legs, so hopefully this colt will be one we get over there and can be competitive with."

For Savabeel (Zabeel), Noverre becomes his 25th Group 1 winner and the boost in sire earnings shot the stallion \$460,000 in front in the standings on the NZ sire premiership, setting him up for an eighth consecutive title.

One of the more expensive purchases by the Te Akau operation, Noverre was sold out of Waikato Stud's Book 1 draft at the 2020 NZB Karaka Yearling Sale for \$800,000.

His breeder, Garry Chittick, bought back into the colt, whose dam and granddam were both two-year-old stakes winners.

Graeme Rogerson sold his dam, Magic Dancer (Rip Van Winkle), to Chittick when she retired and to date the mare has produced four colts in succession, all by Savabeel, Noverre being her first as well as her first to the races.

Noverre's granddam, seven-times winner Dazzling Belle (Desert Sun) was a brave fourth against the boys in the 1999 version of the NZ 2,000 Guineas.

She, herself, visited Savabeel to produce Suriyan in 2006, the granddam of Kinane (Reliable Man), winner of the Frank Packer Plate (Gr 3, 2000m).

Apart from Noverre's dam Magic Dancer, Dazzling Belle also produced Manten (Encosta de Lago), the winner of nine races plus six Group or stakes placings including a second in the Manawatu Sires' Produce Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m).

Noverre descends from Fond Embrace (Resurgent), a three-quarter sister to Listed winner Ruakiwi Lass (Resurgent) who won 13 times. This is the family made famous by the Tapp family in conjunction with Te Rapa Stud near Hamilton.

Avondale Gold Cup (Gr 2, 2200m) winner Wiremu (Arctic Explorer) is from a half-sister to Ruakiwi Lass.

Trelawney triumphs

Not content with two Group 3s and a Group 2 within ten days here in New Zealand, Trelawney Stud added a Flemington Group 2 win when their homebred mare Zayydani (Savabeel) captured the Matriarch Stakes (Gr 2, 2000m) on the final day of the Melbourne Cup Carnival.

Trelawney's Taylor family began their outstanding run on October 16 with Two Illicit (Jimmy Choux) and her superior win in the Red Badge Sprint (Gr 3, 1400m) at Hastings. Eight days later, at Trentham, Cheaperthandivorce (Savabeel) was equally strong in snaring the Group 3 Thompson Handicap (1600m).

The very next day, Labour Day, October 25, their three-year-old Pareanui Bay (Lonhro) scored an emphatic victory in the James & Annie Sarten Memorial (Gr 2, 1400m), racing three-deep the journey.

Capping a sensational few weeks, their beautifully-bred Zayydani (Savabeel) added to her Listed win at Eagle Farm in June with a super win at Flemington, enhancing her already great value.

Back near the rear upon straightening, Zayydani kept to the inner, drove through to form a line of five at the 200 metres, then narrowly took over at the 100 metres and was tenacious to the line.

From 17 starts Zayydani has now won five and with Saturday's Group 2 win she takes her bank account to \$429,000.

Zayydani is a half-sister to Flemington dual Group 1 winner Grunt (O'Reilly) while her dam is a half-sister to Waikato Stud's Cox Plate- (Gr 1, 2040m) winning sire Ocean Park (Thorn Park).

Her third dam, Eastern Princess (Pompeii Court), is a three-quarter sister to Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) winner Courtza (Pompeii Court), the dam of champion sire O'Reilly (Last Tycoon).

All three winning mares will eventually be welcome additions to Trelawney's breeding paddocks. Two Illicit and Zayydani are fiveyear-olds and this season might be their last

hurrah but with the current season only just into its fourth month, there is nothing to suggest that all three can't add to their already valuable black-type records.

The bloodlines of Zayydani and Cheaperthandivorce have much in common. Both mares are bred on the same Savabeel-Van Nistelrooy (Storm Cat) cross.

The similarities don't end there. Zayydani is bred 2X3 to Zabeel (Sir Tristram) and Cheaperthandivorce is bred 3X4 to Zabeel's sire Sir Tristram (Sir Ivor).

Storm Cat (Storm Bird) is also the sire of Tale Of The Cat, damsire of Two Illicit.

First family

Within the space of mere weeks, Waikato Stud's first family is in the news for a fifth time.

Following Group 1 winners Probabeel (Savabeel) and Never Been Kissed (Tivaci), Group 2 winner Forgot You (Savabeel) and Group 3 winner Bellacontte (Burgundy), now arrives the exciting Espiona (Extreme Choice), adding up to five individual stakes winners, just this season, from the wonderful Georgina Belle (Pakistan II) family.

Espiona created a huge impression when bolting away by six lengths in the Desirable Stakes (Listed, 1400m) on Oaks day at Flemington.

Her rider, James McDonald, stated: "I feel embarrassed taking my riding fee for that one," so impressed was he after the race. "She is a very, very smart filly and it will take a crowbar to get me off her. Her acceleration is something to behold. She gives you the feeling of a proper horse and it probably looked as good as it felt."



Espiona

Espiona was having only her second start. Her first, on debut, she won by three and a half lengths at Warwick Farm two weeks prior.

She is from a winning sister to Listed winner Bonny O'Reilly (O'Reilly) and half-sister to Listed winner Pretty To Sea (Ocean Park).

Both Forgot You and Espiona descend from Georgina Belle's granddaughter Celia Leigh (Sound Reason) whereas Probabeel, Never Been Kissed and Bellacontte descend from Celia Leigh's half-sister Habania (Habat).

Kiwis at Flemington

The four-day Melbourne Cup Carnival wrapped up on Saturday and Kiwi-breds more than held their own.

The highlight, of course, was Verry Elleegant (Zed) and her magnificent Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) victory.

Day one, from a Kiwi perspective, belonged to Justacanta (Per Incanto) who has grown another leg since arriving in Victoria, landing his biggest win yet in the Linlithgow Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m).

Tuesday saw three Kiwis first past the post, Verry Elleegant, Excelman (Reliable Man) and Spirit of Gaylard (Puissance de Lune).

For Excelman it was his fourth career win and second in Melbourne, having scored at Caulfield back in May. An attractive grey, Excelman was sold by Westbury Stud at the 2018 Magic Millions Yearling Sale for \$400,000.

Spirit of Gaylard, although conceived in Australia, was sold at the 2020 NZB Karaka Yearling Sales (Book 2) out of the Berkley Stud

Purchased by Phill Cataldo for \$120,000, the colt has started four times and took out the Listed TAB Trophy (1800m).

Lightly-race five-year-old Bermadez (Tavistock) is putting together a nice record and on Oaks day bagged the \$500,000 Melbourne Cup Carnival Handicap (1600m).

It was the fourth win in seven starts for the Mike Moroney \$280,000 purchase and his earnings now exceed \$370,000. Moroney selected him out of Inglewood Stud's Book 1 draft at the 2018 NZB Karaka Yearling Sale.

Day four's highlight was Zayydani (Savabeel) for Trelawney Stud (see above) and the second Kiwi victor was Age Of Chivalry (He's Remarkable).

Qualifying as the best performer by his sire, He's Remarkable (Pentire), Age Of Chivalry got under the guard of practically every buyer and was snapped up for just \$4,000 from the Mapperley Stud draft at the 2018 NZB Karaka Festival Yearling Sale.

The return to the winner's enclosure for the six-year-old was clearly overdue, having twice finished second at Group 1 level two years ago and running some honest races in the meantime.

His maiden stakes win in Saturday's Chatham Stakes (Gr 3, 1400m) was also his fifth career win and his earnings have topped \$725,000.

Age Of Chivalry is from a sister or halfsister to two stakes-placed winners including Alyssum (Prized), the dam of Thompson Handicap (Gr 3, 1600m) winner Pero (Storming Home). His granddam, Kay Row (Long Row) won eight including the Awapuni Gold Cup (Gr 2, 2000m).

Too speedy

Fresh up from a strong Group 3 win in the Cambridge Breeders' Stakes (1200m) last May, Babylon Berlin (All Too Hard) was much too speedy in taking out her fifth career win in the Pegasus Stakes (Listed, 1000m).

Carving out the last 600 metres in 32.40 seconds, Babylon Berlin gave her opponents little hope of catching her, leading for most of the journey and logging a smart 56.53 seconds for the 1000-metre dash.

The mare will bypass Riccarton's premier sprint, the Stewards' Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) and will now be set for the Railway Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m).

Good upset

The Legacy Lodge Sprint (Listed, 1200m) at Te Rapa on Saturday resulted in a surprise victory for Raposa Rapida (Foxwedge).

His performance, however, was a very good one as he was trapped three-deep the entire race.

He looked in for a comfortable victory when striding to the lead at the 100 metres but had to dig deep to hold on by a head.

The younger brother to Railway Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) winner Volpe Veloce (Foxwedge), the seven-year-old earned his seventh career win, which also represents his maiden stakes win.

The filly is out of the winning Whipper (Miesque's Son) mare Whipcla, making her a half-sister to four winners headed by Group 3 scorer Chasedown (Nathaniel) and stakesplaced pair Keep And Love (Lope De Vega) and Wild Explosion (The Gurkha). Whipcla herself is a half-sister to the dam of Group 1-winning trio Crackerjack King (Shamardal), Awelmarduk (Almutawakel) and Jakkalberry (Storming Home), who stood at Novara Park until his untimely death in 2018. Churchill is standing at Coolmore Stud in the Hunter Valley for a fee of \$22,000 (inc GST).

Overshare - Spendthrift Farm first season sire Overshare (I Am Invincible) landed his first winner from his first runner when the Annabel Neasham-trained Lady Laguna (2 f ex Catalina De Lago by Encosta De Lago) won the QTIS Two-Year-Old Handicap (1000m) at Eagle Farm. Lady Laguna won by half a length over Goddess Of Peace (Caravaggio), with Mishani Mistress (Kobayashi) two and a quarter lengths behind the winner in third as first season sires filled the places. Racing in the OTI silks, Lady Laguna is the second foal out of New Zealand winner Catalina De Lago, a half-sister to Group 2 winner She Will Be Loved (Strategic) as well as the stakes-placed pair Mya (Desert King) and Thorn Dancer (Thorn Park). Lady Laguna is one

of 55 foals from the first crop of Overshare who stands this season for a fee of \$11,000 (inc GST) at the Victorian stud.

New Group 1 / Grade 1 winners

Dubawi - It was a very good week for Dubawi (Dubai Millenium) as he brought up elite-level winners number 47 and 48. Modern Games (2 c ex Modern Ideals by New Approach) claimed a surreal renewal of the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf (Gr 1, 8f), with the Godolphin colt initially scratched but then reinstated following an incident at the barriers. The Charlie Appleby-trained juvenile defeated Tiz The Bomb (Hit It A Bomb) by one and a half lengths with Mackinnon (American Pharoah) a neck third. Modern Games, who is out of a half-sister to Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere (Gr 1,

1400m) winner Ultra (Manduro) and Group 3 winner Synopsis (In The Wings), became the 47th individual elite-level winner for his Darley stallion Dubawi. Not long after, Yibir (3 g ex Rumh by Monsun) produced an emphatic victory in the Breeders' Cup Turf (Gr 1, 12f) to give Dubawi his 48th elite-level winner. Yibir, who won the Bahrain Trophy (Gr 3, 1m 5f) and the Great Voltigeur Stakes (Gr 1, 1m 4f) in the UK before shipping stateside, had won the third leg of New York's Turf Triple, the Jockey Club Derby (Listed, 12f) at Belmont in September, following in the footsteps of Cox Plate (Gr 1, 2040m) winner State Of Rest (Starspangledbanner) who took out the second leg, the Saratoga Derby (Gr 1, 9.5f), in August. Kept in the United States, he targeted the Breeders' Cup Turf, with the Charlie Appleby trainee showing that he will be a globetrotting

force for years to come with a half-length victory that does little to reflect his dominance. Broome (Australia) bounced back to form after a disappointing Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe (Gr 1, 2400m) display, finishing second, while Prix Vermeille (Gr 1, 2400m) winner Teona (Sea The Stars) was a further length and a half away in third. Darley is yet to announce their European stallion fees for 2022.

Fastnet Rock - Fastnet Rock (Danehill) added another landmark accolade to his glittering stallion career as he sired his first Breeders' Cup winner through Juvenile Fillies Turf (Gr 1, 8f) scorer Pizza Bianca (2 f ex White Hot by Galileo) at Del Mar. The filly became the 42nd individual elite-level winner for Coolmore sire Fastnet Rock, and his 182nd individual stakes winner. Pizza Bianca finished runnerup to British raider Wild Beauty (Frankel) in the Natalma Stakes (Gr 1, 8f) at Woodbine in September on her previous outing, but went one better in defeating Malavath (Mehmas) by half a length with Haughty (Empire Maker) a neck further back in third. Pizza Bianca is out of the unraced Galileo (Sadler's Wells) mare White Hot, a half-sister to Epsom Derby (Gr 1,

1m 4f) winner Pour Moi (Montjeu) and dual Group 3 winner Gagnoa (Sadler's Wells), as well as a sister to stakes winners Kissed and Dawn Patrol. A homebred for Bobby Flay, Pizza Bianca takes her record to two wins from three starts. Champion Sire Fastnet Rock stands for a fee of \$165,000 (inc GST) at Coolmore this year.

Hard Spun - Darley stallion Hard Spun (Danzig) registered his 15th individual Grade 1 winner when Aloha West (4 c ex Island Bound by Speightstown) caused a minor upset in the Breeders' Cup Sprint (Gr 1, 6f) at Del Mar. Second favourite Dr Schivel (Violence) looked home for all money, kicking well clear late into the stretch, but Aloha West flew from nowhere to make it a photo on the wire. After minutes of deliberation, the Wayne Catalano-trained Aloha West - who races in the same Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners colours as 2017 VRC Oaks (Gr 1, 2500m) winner Pinot (Pierro) was announced as the winner. It was a first stakes victory for Aloha West, having been beaten at his previous two attempts against black-type company. Hard Spun will stand at Jonabell Farm in Kentucky for \$35,000 (approx. AU\$46,900) next season.

Into Mischief - A third straight title as North America's leading sire awaits Into Mischief (Harlan's Holiday) after the Spendthrift stallion brought up his 11th individual Grade 1 winner when the WinStar Farm and China Horse Club-owned Life Is Good (3 c ex Beach Walk by Distorted Humor) blitzed his Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile (Gr 1, 8f) rivals at Del Mar. Sent off as one of the hottest favourite of the championship meeting, the Todd Pletcher-prepared Life Is Good never looked in any doubt, leading all the way to record an emphatic five and three-quarter length success over Ginobili (Munnings) with outsider Restrainedvengeance (Hold Me Back) running a gallant third having tossed his head up at the start. Life Is Good is likely to target the US\$20 million Saudi Cup (Gr 1, 1800m) before attempting to follow 2020 Dirt Mile winner Knicks Go (Paynter) in taking out the Breeders' Cup Classic (Gr 1, 10f) this time next year. Into Mischief will stand for 250,000 (approx. AU\$335,000) in 2022.

Kermadec - Willowy (3 f ex Dextrous by Quest For Fame) became the second individual Group 1 winner for her sire Kermadec (Teofilo) when winning the VRC Oaks (Gr 1, 2500m) at Flemington. The James Cummings-trained filly landed the Classic under Damien Oliver by a head from Douceur (No Nay Never) in second, with a further two lengths back to Biscayne Bay (Sebring) in third. The Godolphin homebred debuted in August and broke her maiden at start four. She followed that breakthrough with a half-length score in the Wakeful Stakes (Gr 2, 2000m) as a lead-in to her Oaks triumph. Willowy is the last of 11 foals, all winners, out of the 2002 Sandown Guineas (Gr 2, 1600m) winner Dextrous (Quest For Fame). The mare has also produced the Group 1-winning twoyear-old Skilled (Commands) and the Group 2 winners Sidestep (Exceed And Excel) and Ambidexter (Commands). Kermadec has also produced the triple Group 1-winning mare Montefilia. The Doncaster Mile (Gr 1, 1600m) winner stands at Darley's Northwood Park in Victoria for a 2021 fee of \$11,000 (inc. GST).

Orfevre - Japanese cult hero Orfevre (Stay Gold) finally brought up the Group 1 win on the world stage that had eluded him in his racing days when his daughter Marche Lorraine (5 m ex Vite Marcher by French Deputy) scored an upset victory in the Breeders' Cup Distaff (Gr 1, 9f) at Del Mar, becoming his third elite-level winner in the process. Marche Lorraine has made her name on the second-tier NAR circuit in Japan, winning four stakes races, but the Breeders' Cup Distaff loomed as a different test entirely against most of the best mares on the surface in the United States. As a result, she was sent off at 50-1 on the local parimutuel tote, although much bigger prices were available with bookmakers abroad. However, under a daring Oisin Murphy ride, Marche Lorraine made an early bid before holding off the late surge of the luckless Dunbar Road (Quality Road) to win by a nose with Kentucky Oaks (Gr 1, 9f) heroine Malathaat (Curlin) a further half-length away in third. It was a second win on the card for Cox Plate-winning trainer Yoshito Yahagi after Loves Only You (Deep Impact) took out the Breeders' Cup Filly &

Mare Turf (Gr 1, 11f). Orfevre will stand at Shadai Stallion Station in Japan for ¥3,500,000 (approx. AU\$41,350) in 2022.

Savabeel - An impressive display from Te Akau Racing's Noverre (3 c ex Magic Dancer by Rip Van Winkle) saw the colt become the 25th individual Group 1 winner for his Waikato Stud sire Savabeel (Zabeel), as he claimed the New Zealand 2,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) at Riccarton. Noverre stormed home from the rear of the field under Opie Bosson to win by a convincing two and three-quarter lengths over Meritable (Snitzel) and Field Of Gold (Starspangledbanner). An \$800,000 buy for David Ellis from the NZB Karaka Yearling Sale, Noverre is the first foal from Group 3 winner Magic Dancer. Champion sire Savabeel, whose tally of seven individual stakes winners in Australasia this season is second to only Snitzel's (Redoute's Choice) eight, stands for a fee of \$100,000 (Plus GST) this season.

Uncle Mo - Golden Pal (3 c ex Lady Shipman by Midshipman) avenged his dam's narrow defeat in the Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint (Gr 1, 5f) in 2015 by taking out the feature at Del Mar, giving Coolmore's Uncle Mo (Indian Charlie) his tenth individual Grade 1 winner. The Wesley Ward-trained Golden Pal, who won the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Sprint (Gr 2, 5.5f) last year at Keeneland, carried Irad Ortiz Jr in the Coolmore navy blue to victory in a sustained demonstration of speed, defeating last-start Grade 2 winner Lieutenant Dan (Grazen) by a length and a quarter with a gap of three and a half lengths between the runner-up and third-placed Charmaine's Mia (The Factor). Uncle Mo, who is expecting his tenth crop of foals in the new year, will stand for \$160,000 (approx. AU\$214,400) at Coolmore's Ashford Stud in Kentucky in 2022.

New stakes winners

Cotai Glory - Purciaretta (2 f ex Sharqawiyah by Dubawi) won her first two starts at Rome over this course and distance and she returned to break through at stakes level on her seventh start in the Premio Divino Amore (Listed, 1000m). She became the second individual stakes winner from the first crop of Tally-Ho sire Cotai Glory (Exceed And Excel), after dual Group scorer Atomic Force. Ridden by Dario Tocco, Purciaretta was a decisive three-and-a-quarter-length winner Stay Kitten (Smokem Kitten) while Fighting King (Bobby's Kitten) was a further length behind in third. Sold for £3,000 as a yearling at Goffs, Purciaretta is a half-sister to Group 3 scorer Abby Hatcher (Acclamation) out of the winning Dubawi (Dubai Millennium) mare Sharqawiyah, while it is the further family of Group 1 winner and sire Poet's Word (Poet's Voice). Cotai Glory stood this year for a fee of €5,000 (approx. AU\$7,800).

Declaration Of War - It was a good week for Declaration of War (War Front) as he sired his 38th and 39th individual stakes winners. Cheval Prometteur (6 g ex Shibina by Kalanisi) built on the promise of his run in the Livamol Classic (Gr 1, 2040m) on his most recent start

Now trained by Catherine Cameron, the well-travelled gelding won for the fifth time on his 20th start when beating Concert Hall (Savabeel) and Robusto (Zed). Cheval Prometteur is the sixth foal out of the Kalanisi (Doyoun) mare Shibina who herself is a half-sister to the Irish Derby (Gr 1, 1m 4f) third Shalapour (Darshaan). Declaration of War stands at Shizunai Stallion Station in Japan. Electric Girl (5 m ex Electra by Zizou), won the Hot Danish Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m) at Flemington to give the sire his 39th individual stakes winner. The Team Hawkes-trained Electric Girl ran out a half-length winner over favourite Rocha Clock (Pierro), with Madam Rouge (Zoustar) a further long neck away in third. A homebred for Superhorse Trust, Electric Girl was winning for the sixth time in her 20-start career. She is the second foal out of the unplaced Electra, whose third dam is South African Grade 2 winner Autumn Lodge (Grand Lodge). Declaration Of War stands for a fee of US\$25,000 (approx. AU\$33,500) at Ashford Stud in Kentucky.

Divine Prophet - See You In Heaven (2 f ex Shine On Anna by Anabaa) earned a debut win in the Ottawa Stakes (Gr 3, 1000m) at Flemington to become the first stakes winner for her sire Divine Prophet (Choisir). The Richard and Chantelle Jolly-trained juvenile scored by a length and a quarter under Craig Williams, with Satin Love (Snitzel) second and Bohemian Daisy (Hellbent) third. "She's got really nice speed. The only thing about her characteristics is that she likes to kick other horses. That's the only thing I had to deal with pre-race, that she didn't injure anyone else," Williams said. "She's very professional, has very good ability and everyone could see that today." The Jollys paid \$90,000 for See You In Heaven at the Gold Coast Yearling Sale when offered by Alexia Fraser Bloodstock, the filly having initially been bought by Kestrel Thoroughbreds for \$27,000 out of the Aguis draft at the Magic Millions National Weanling Sale. She is the fifth winner and first stakes scorer out of her dam

Shine On Anna, whose own dam Shine On Me (Machiavellian) was Listed placed in France. Divine Prophet stands at Aquis Farm at a fee of \$16,500 (inc. GST).

Extreme Choice - Extreme Choice (Not A Single Doubt) earned his sixth individual stakes winner as a sire when Espiona (3 f ex Dahooil by O'Reilly) took her career record to two from two in the Desirable Stakes (Listed, 1400m) at Flemington. The Chris Waller-trained threeyear-old debuted with a three-and-a-halflength success at Warwick Farm on October 13 and bettered that this time under James McDonald when charging six and a half lengths clear of second-placed Star Of Chaos (Zoustar), with the third-placed Star Waltz (Snitzel) a further head behind in third. Torryburn Stud offered Espiona at the Gold Coast Yearling Sale and she sold to Star Thoroughbreds and Randwick Bloodstock Agency for \$150,000. The filly is the first foal out of Dahooi (O'Reilly), a sister to the stakes winner Bonny O'Reilly (O'Reilly), whose dam Pretty (Pins) is a halfsister to the Group 1 winners Vision And Power (Carnegie) and Glamour Puss (Tale Of The Cat). Extreme Choice stands at Newgate Farm for a private fee.

Fastnet Rock - The step up in trip worked the oracle for Atzeco (3 c ex Examinee by Monsun) as he won the St Leger Italiano (Gr 3, 3000m) at Rome and gave Fastnet Rock (Danehill) his 181st individual stakes winner. Having twice placed in Listed contests in the summer, the Alduino Botti-trained three-yearold was ridden by Dario Vargiu to a threequarter length success over Tangut (Adlerflug) with Unique Diamond (English Channel) a further two and a half lengths back in third. The third foal out of unraced mare Examinee (Monsun), who herself is a sister to the Group 3 winner Energizer, Atzeco is a half-brother to winners Bobby Ewing (Charm Spirit) and Pass Mark (Raven's Pass). Multiple Champion Sire Fastnet Rock stood at Coolmore's Jerrys Plains in 2021 for a fee of \$165,000.

Foxwedge - The Stephen Marsh-trained outsider Raposa Rapida (7 g ex Bardego by Barathea) led home a stable quinella in the Legacy Lodge Sprint (Listed, 1200m) at Te Rapa. The seven-year-old second-crop foal was sent off a \$35 chance, with stablemate and runner-up Run To Perfection (Sepov) the \$3.90 favourite. However, Raposa Rapida held off his rival to win by a neck, with Mascarpone

He (Raposa Rapida) has run some ripping races throughout his career and this could be his best campaign." The Go Racing-owned gelding, who was a \$150,000 purchase from the Inglis Easter yearling sale, is a brother to Group 1 winner Volpe Veloce and becomes the 23rd individual stakes winner for his sire Foxwedge (Fastnet Rock), who stands at Woodside Park Stud for a fee of \$11,000 (inc GST).

Frankel - Outsider Vesela (3 f ex Arabesque by Zafonic) outran her 22-1 odds to land the Gillies Fillies' Stakes (Listed, 1m 2f) at Doncaster for Juddmonte. The Ralph Becketttrained homebred travelled well under Rob Hornby, led in the final furlong and kept on well to win by three quarters of a length from Something Enticing (Fascinating Rock), while there was the same distance back to Lady Hayes (Kodiac) in third. Vesela broke her maiden on her second start last term on her only other start on soft going. She has twice been placed in Listed company this term from four other starts and this was her first stakes success and she became the 81st individual stakes winner for her sire Frankel (Galileo). Vesela is a half-sister to Group 2 winner and sire Showcasing (Oasis Dream) and stakes winner and sire Camacho (Danehill), as well as four other stakes performers produced by the Flying Fillies' Stakes (Listed, 6f) scorer Arabesque (Zafonic). Frankel stands at Juddmonte's Banstead Manor Stud in Newmarket where his fee this year was £175,000 (Approx. AU\$319,000).

Galileo - The late Galileo (Sadler's Wells) sired a 345th individual stakes winner at Dundalk when the unfancied Friendly (3 f ex Massarra by Danehill) won the Cooley Fillies Stakes (Listed, 1m) on the all-weather. Sent

off a 33-1 chance, Friendly beat Surrounding (Lilbourne Lad) by two and a half lengths, with So I Told You (Gleneagles) a nose third. The 12th foal out of Listed winner Massarra, Friendly is a half-sister to Italian Group 1 winner Nayarra (Cape Cross), as well as a sister to Group 2-winning juvenile Gustav Klimt.

Gleneagles - Lajoscha (3 c ex Lady Linda by Torrential) gave Gleneagles (Galileo) an 18th individual stakes winner when he caused a boil over in the Grand Prix Du Nord (Listed, 2000m) at Chantilly. The three-year-old colt made all from the outset and quickened clear to comfortably beat the Listed-placed In Crowd (Dubawi) with favourite Baratti (Frankel) back in third. A 115,000gns purchase by Litex Commerce AD out of Britton House Stud at the Tattersalls Book 1 Sale in 2019, Lajoscha's win was a timely boost for connections as the colt is entered in the upcoming Arqana Deauville Autumn Sale on November 15. The 11th foal out of Group 3-placed mare Lady Linda (Torrential), Lajoscha is closely related to winner Top Fox (Frankel) and is a half-brother

to nine winners including German Oaks (Gr 1, 2200m) winner Penelopa (Giant's Causeway). Gleneagles stood at Coolmore Stud in 2021 for a fee of ε 25,000 (approx. AU\$38,800).

Golden Horn - Shandoz (4 g ex Shabyt by Sadler's Wells) gave Darley's Golden Horn (Cape Cross) his eighth individual stakes winner when he took out the Floodlit Stakes (Listed, 1m 4f) at Kempton. Trained by Roger Varian and ridden by David Egan, the four-year-old showed good improvement on his first foray into stakes grade to beat the Godolphin-owned pair Desert Fire (Cape Cross) and Dubai Future (Dubawi) by a length and a neck respectively. Bred by Hesmonds Stud and owned by Nurlan Bizakov, the gelding is the fifth foal out of unraced mare Shabyt (Sadler's Wells), who herself is closely related to Group 1 winners Japan (Galileo) and Mogul (Galileo) and the Group 2 winner Secret Gesture (Galileo). Shandoz is a half-brother to winners Shymkent (Pivotal), Shaherezada (Dutch Art) and Shagalla (Lawman). Golden Horn stood at Dalham Hall Stud in 2021 for a fee of £20,000 (approx. AU\$36,300).

He's Remarkable - Age Of Chivalry (6 g ex Onyx by Kaapstad) finally broke through for a first stakes success at start 23, despite having been twice Group 1-placed in his career. The Mathew Ellerton and Simon Zahra-trained six-year-old battled well to take the Chatham Stakes (Gr 3, 1400m) ahead of Crosshaven (Smart Missile). The winning margin was a long neck, with last-start Group 2 winner Justacanta (Per Incanto) a length from the winner in third. Age Of Chivalry, who became the second individual stakes winner for He's Remarkable (Pentire), was landing a first win since August 2019 when he took out a Caulfield handicap. His next two starts saw him run second in the Sir Rupert Clarke Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) and third in the Toorak Handicap (Gr 1, 1600m), but he had drawn a blank in 11 subsequent starts. A NZ\$50,000 two-year-old buy for Henry Plumptre, he was first bought as a yearling for just NZ\$4,000 by Suncroft Bloodstock.

I Am Invincible - Yarraman Park's I Am Invincible (Invincible Spirit) sired his 67th individual stakes winner courtesy of victory for Quantico (5 g ex Hoss Amor by General Nediym) in the concluding MSS Security Sprint (Listed, 1200 metres) at Flemington. The John O'Sheatrained gelding was winning for the sixth time in ten starts as he beat Sirius Suspect (Wanted) by a length and a half. Prime Candidate (Denman) was a further length behind the runner-up in third. A \$1,050,000 Inglis Easter purchase from the Yarraman Park draft for China Horse Club/John O'Shea Racing/Boomer Bloodstock, Quantico runs for a syndicate that includes his co-breeders Yarraman Park and Jason Abrahams. He is one of two winners from the stakes-winning mare Hoss Amor (General Nediym) who has a yearling filly by Hellbent (I Am Invincible) and a colt foal by the same sire. She has now been covered by Bivouac (Exceed And Excel). I Am Invincible stands for a fee of \$220,000 (inc GST).

Into Mischief - Spendthrift stallion Into Mischief (Harlan's Holiday) reached a landmark

century of stakes winners at the start of last month, and he added stakes winner number 101 at Belmont on Friday when Gerrymander (2 f ex Ruby Lips by Hard Spun) won the Tempted Stakes (Listed, 8f). The Klaravich Stables-owned filly finished a distant runnerup to Echo Zulu last time out in the Frizette Stakes, and that form proved too good for her rivals, with Gerrymander defeating Magic Circle (Kantharos) by half a length, while Nest (Curlin) finished a neck further away in third. Into Mischief will stand for an increased fee of \$250,000 (approx. AU\$335,000) in 2022, having last year commanded the most expensive stud fee in the US at \$225,000.

Niagara - The Oaks Stud's Niagara (Encosta De Lago) earned a fourth individual stakes winner courtesy of Mr Intelligence (6 g ex All Knowledge by Knowledge), who prevailed in the Metropolitan Trophy Handicap (Listed, 2500m) at Riccarton. Mr Intelligence defeated Beaudz Well (Zed), part-owned by New Zealand rugby star Beauden Barrett, by one and a half lengths, with Madam De Soir (Raise The Flag) two and a quarter lengths behind the winner in third. The six-year-old struck at stakes level for the first time at start 29, with this a sixth career success. The gelding was bought by trainers Nikki and Barrie Blatch for \$4,750 from the Gavelhouse platform in 2018. Niagara stands for a fee of \$5,000 (plus GST) in 2021.

Not A Single Doubt - Flying Evelyn (3 f ex Champagne Run by More Than Ready) gave her pensioned sire Not A Single Doubt (Redoute's Choice) his 78th individual stakes winner when successful in the Red Roses Stakes (Gr 3, 1100m) at Flemington. The Anthony and Sam Freedman-trained filly lifted late to take the contest under Brett Prebble by half a length from A Very Fine Red (Deep Field), with thirdplaced Seradess (Astern) a further head behind. Flying Evelyn relished the straight track sprint as she sealed her second career win at her sixth start, having nailed a maiden win on debut in February. Between times, the filly earned a Group 3 placing last term when second in the Thoroughbred Breeders Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m), also at Flemington. Offered by her breeder Arrowfield at the Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale, Flying Evelyn sold to John Sadler Racing for \$500,000. She is the fourth foal to race, and fourth winner, out of her dam, who is a daughter of the Group 1 winner Bollinger (Dehere) and a half-sister to the Group/Grade 2 winners Villermont (All Too Hard) and Friesan Fire (A.P. Indy). The third dam is the Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) winner Bint Marscay (Marscay).

Not This Time - Taylor Made Farm stallion Not This Time (Giant's Causeway) sired his 14th individual stakes winner when Howling Time (2 c ex Werewolf by Arch) won the Street Sense Stakes (Listed, 8.5f) at Churchill Downs. Trained by Dale Romans and ridden by Joseph Talamo, the two-year-old colt was settled in fourth before making a move on the home bend, ranging up to then leader Red Danger (Orb) and drawing clear from that rival to win by three and a quarter lengths with Red Knobs (Union Rags) a further four lengths back in third place. Now with two wins from his two starts, Howling Time was a \$200,000 purchase for the Albaugh family out of the Paramount Sales' consignment at the 2020 Keeneland September Yearling Sale. Bred by Springhouse Farm, the colt is the second foal and second winner for his dam Werewolf (Arch), whose third foal is a weanling colt by Air Force Blue (War Front). Lord Kanaloa - King Hermes (2 c ex Stellar Lead by Special Week) returned a convincing winner of the Keio Hai Nisai Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m) at Tokyo, providing his sire Lord Kanaloa (King Kamehameha) with a 33rd individual stakes winner. The Yoshito Yahagitrained colt defeated Toshin Macau (Big Arthur) by a length and a quarter with Lovely Your Eyes (Logotype) two lengths from the winner in third

as favourite Carolline (Daiwa Major) ran fourth. Lord Kanaloa stands at Shadai Stallion Station where his 2021 fee was listed as ¥15,000,000 (approx. AU\$178,865).

Olympic Glory - Tourbillon Diamond (5 g ex Modave by Montjeu) claimed a first stakes success in the Sa Sa Ladies' Purse (Gr 3, 1800m) at Sha Tin, after he prevailed in a thrilling $blanket\,finish, with\,the\,first\,five\,home\,separated$ by just three-quarters of a length. Carrying the lightest weight of the field, the Danny Shumtrained five-year-old held off the battling Ka Ying Star (Cityscape) by a short-head, with Reliable Team (Reliable Man) a neck third. A \$7,000 buy out of the Magic Millions National Yearling Sale for Neil Douglas, Tourbillon Diamond earned four wins and a Group 1 placing in the Australian Derby (Gr 1, 2400m) prior to his export for trainer Stuart Kendrick, when named Eric The Eel. The victory added a second success in Hong Kong for the five-yearold. Former shuttler Olympic Glory (Choisir) stands at Al Shaqab's Haras de Bouquetot for a fee of €4,000 (approx. AU\$6,250).

Puissance De Lune - A victory for Spirit Of Gaylard (3 c ex White Dove by High Chaparral) in the TAB Trophy (Listed, 1800m) at Flemington provided Swettenham Stud's Puissance De Lune (Shamardal) with his third individual stakes winner. Carrying the colours of 2015 Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) winner Prince Of Penzance (Pentire), the Mitch Freedman-trained three-year-old was given a perfectly timed ride by Jordan Childs to defeat Blushing Tycoon (Written Tycoon) by a halfhead. Maracana (Shamexpress) was just a halfneck back in third. Purchased by Phill Cataldo Bloodstock and Mitch Freedman for \$120,000 out of the Berkley Stud draft at the 2020 NZB Karaka Yearling Sale Book 2, Spirit Of Gaylard is the sole winner from two to race out of the five-time winner White Dove (High Chaparral),

who herself was purchased for \$32,000 at the 2018 Inglis Great Southern Sale when carrying Spirit Of Gaylard. White Dove has a yearling filly by War Decree (War Front) and was covered by him again last season. Puissance De Lune stands for a fee of \$19,800 (inc GST).

Pyro - Meisho Hario (4 c ex Meisho Ohi by Manhattan Cafe) struck for a first stakes success in the Miyako Stakes (Gr 3, 1800m) at Hanshin, becoming the seventh individual stakes winner for his sire Pyro (Pulpit). Exploding from the pack in the closing stages, Meisho Hario held off the late challenge of Lord Bless (Danon Ballade) to win by a nose, with early leader Another Truth (I'll Have Another) holding on for third, two and a half lengths adrift of the leading duo. The Inao Okada-trained fouryear-old takes his record to five wins from 13 starts. Meisho Hario is out of Manhattan Cafe (Sunday Silence) mare Meisho Ohi, who herself is a half-sister to Grade 2-placed colt Meisho Kadomatsu (Daiwa Major). Pyro stands at Darley's Japanese Stallion Complex.

Reliable Man - German raider Ardakan (2 c ex Alaskakonigin by Sternkonig) broke his maiden in style on his third start and became the 17th individual stakes winner for Westbury Stud shuttler Reliable Man (Dalakhani) when taking out the Premio Guido Berardelli (Gr 3, 1800m) at Rome. Placed on his first two outings for Markus Klug, Ardakan hacked up by six lengths from Crystal Drake (Full Drago) while Wonka Willy (Estidkhaar) was a close third. Ardakan is a half-brother to the Diana Trial-(Listed, 2000m) placed Alaskasonne (Soldier Hollow) out of the stakes winner Alaskakonigin (Sternkonig). Reliable Man, sire of Group 1 winners Miami Bound and Inspirational Girl, stands at Gestut Rottgen where his fee this year was €6,500 while he is available at Westbury Stud for a fee of NZ\$17,500 (Plus GST) this year.

Safeguard - Safeguard (Exceed and Excel) joined the ranks of stakes-winning stallions when the consistent Buzzoom (3 f ex Xaar Boom by Xaar) notched her latest victory in the Burgess Queen Stakes (Listed, 1400m) at Ascot. The Daniel Morton-trained filly was winning for the third successive time as she beat Searchin' Roc's (Awesome Rock) and Flying Missile (Cable Bay). Safeguard, a dual Group 3-winning juvenile for Godolphin, stands at Mogumber Park in WA for a fee of \$4,400 (inc GST).

Snitzel Snitzel (Redoute's Choice) continued his excellent season with his threeyear-old crop as Bend The Knee (3 c ex Kneeling by Encosta De Lago) became the seventh individual stakes winner this campaign from his 2018-born produce and his 116th individual stakes winner overall in winning The Amanda Elliott (Listed, 1400m). Kicking off a Group 1-winning day at Flemington for owner Carl Holt, Bend The Knee prevailed in a thrilling duel with Port Louis (Maurice), whose wait for a first win continues despite now being placed twice at stakes level. The margin was a neck, with a one-and-a-half-length gap back to Daily Bugle (Press Statement) in third. Bend The Knee was a \$300,000 buy for his trainer John O'Shea from the Arrowfield draft at the Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale. He is the third foal and third winner out of the dual Listed scorer Kneeling (Encosta De Lago), a half-sister to stakes winners That's A Good Idea (Flying Spur) and Winner's Way (Starcraft). The mare has a two-year-old filly by Snitzel named Dashing Legend, a \$380,000 buy for Bon Ho at this year's Inglis Easter sale, while she also has a yearling filly by The Autumn Sun (Redoute's Choice) and was not served last year. Snitzel stands at Arrowfield for a fee of \$165,000 (inc GST).

Take Charge Indy - A G Indy (4 m ex Hong Kong Silver by Badge Of Silver) struck for success at the Breeders' Cup held at Del Mar, winning the opening Senator Ken Maddy Stakes

(Listed, 5f). The four-year-old defeated Time Limit (Bustin Stones) by a neck, Hear My Prayer (The Big Beast) a further half a length away in third. A G Indy became Florida Derby (Gr 1, 8.5f) winner Take Charge Indy's (A.P. Indy) 14th individual stakes winner. The stallion will stand the 2022 season at WinStar Farm for a fee of \$12,500 (approx. AU\$16,750).

Tapit - Subconscious (3 g ex Sweet Dreams by Candy Ride) became the 150th individual stakes winner for Gainesway stallion Tapit (Pulpit) when he landed the Twilight Derby (Gr 2, 9f) at Santa Anita. Now a winner of his last three starts, the three-year-old gelding stayed on well to beat Cathkin Peak (Alhebayeb) by a length and a quarter with Beyond Brilliant (Twirling Candy) a further half-length back in third. A \$380,000 purchase as a weanling at the 2018 Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale, Subconscious is the third foal out of Canadian stakes-placed mare Sweet Dreams (Candy Ride), herself a half-sister to Grade 2 winner Strike Charmer (Smart Strike). Tapit will stand for a fee of \$185,000 (approx. AU\$246,500) in 2022.

Winning Rupert - Newgate Farm's Winning Rupert (Written Tycoon) scored a first crop stakes winner as It'sarayday (3 g ex Wild Soiree by Fusaichi Pegasus) headed a Simon Millertrained quinella to win the Fairetha Stakes (Listed, 1400m) at Ascot. The three-year-old takes his record to an eye-catching three wins

from four starts, with his only blemish a second placing in the Belgravia Stakes (Listed, 1200m) on his previous outing when behind Searchin' Roc's (Awesome Rock), and he could now target the WA Guineas (Gr 2, 1600m) later this month. It's arayday defeated his stablemate Stay Safe (Safeguard) by one and a quarter lengths with Pale Rider (Rommel) a neck further back in third. A seventh foal and seventh winner for US-bred mare Wild Soiree (Fusaichi Pegasus), who herself is a half-sister to Group 3 winner Musidora (Rock Of Gibraltar), It'sarayday was an \$80,000 buy from the Inglis Classic Sale for his trainer. Winning Rupert, who has also sired the stakes-placed pair Tonneofgrit and Bolsonaro, stands for a fee of \$11,000 (inc GST) this year.

Zoustar - Big-money buy Brereton (2 c ex Fuddle Dee Duddle by Red Ransom) provided Widden Stud resident Zoustar (Northern Meteor) with his 25th individual stakes winner when building on the promise of his debut second to take out the Maribyrnong Plate (Gr 3, 1000m) at Flemington. The Peter Moody-trained juvenile, who was beaten just a nose in the Debutant Stakes (Listed, 1000m), prevailed by that same margin as he got the better of Renosu (Exceed And Excel). Le Gagneur (Shalaa) was two and three-quarters away in third. Brereton, who was purchased for \$1 million from this year's Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale and marks the first winner and stakes winner for the Victorian Alliance colts syndicate, which was first active at yearling sales last year. He was bred by Widden in partnership with Saconi Thoroughbreds. He is the third winner from three foals to race from Group 3 winner Fuddle Dee Duddle (Red Ransom), who herself is a half-sister to Group 2 winner Hallowell Belle (Starcraft) and Bella Orfana (Star Witness), dam of the Group 1-placed Bella Nipotina (Pride Of Dubai). Fuddle Dee Duddle has a yearling colt by Trapeze Artist (Snitzel) and produced a filly foal this spring by Zoustar, who stands for a fee of \$154,000 (inc GST).


